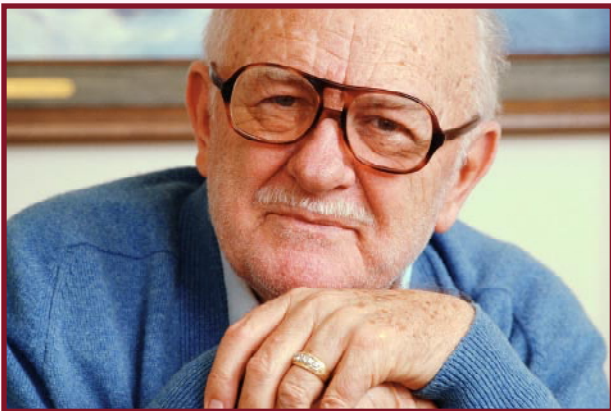

Volunteers are thoroughly trained. At the end of the training, volunteers have sufficient knowledge to perform their duties.

A Volunteer's hours will vary depending on the assignment, the patient, and family needs. There is no specific hour requirement, however, a commitment to serve one year is requested.



*** Frequently Asked Questions ***

Q. What is Hospice?

A. Hospice is a specialized kind of care for people with a terminal illness and a support system for their families.

Q. What kind of work do volunteers perform?

A. Volunteers serve in the home helping out with transportation, companionship, running errands, reading or other things as needed.

Volunteers also serve in the office working on correspondence, filing, and computer work.

Volunteers can also provide spiritual and/ or bereavement support.

Q. What type of training do volunteers receive?

A. Volunteers are trained in several areas including Hospice philosophy, interdisciplinary team concept, signs and symptoms of dying, infection control, emergency procedures, grief, confidentiality, and bereavement. Practical matters of whom to report to, duties, and responsibilities will be covered.

Q. What other requirements are needed?

A. Volunteers are required to have a TB test, submit a copy of their drivers' license, current auto insurance, and also a criminal background check.

Q. What type of person volunteers for Hospice?

A. The volunteers are as varied as the patients they help. The criteria are that a person be willing, mature, compassionate, and have some time to give.
